*Biogr.* :

Julius Ceasar Bulengerus (Bulenger, Boulenger), b. Loudun 1558, d. Cahors August 1, 1628. Son of Petrus Bulengerus, a noted and versatile scholar. Was a member of the Jesuit order 1582-94 and 1620-28. Taught at Paris, Toulouse and Pisa. His numerous published works deal with theology, history and classical antiquity, and he also published poems and orations. His unpublished writings include commentaries on Statius, Vergil, Lucan, Cicero (Utrecht, mss. 831 and 832), Persius (Troyes, ms. 1278 and 2041), Pomponius Mela and Symmachus (Paris BN lat. 10822).
